



Aloe Vera



A succulent plant perfect for making rejuvenation medicines at short notice. Heals various ailments such as Golem-skin gout and pox-bum.

Arnica

Herbaceous sunflower primarily for use in soothing ointments.

Growing wild in small pockets of Greenbury, this plant has proven invaluable to many travellers.



Basil



Originally from the eastern lands, this aromatic culinary herb now has a small home in Greenbury. Useful also for anti anxiety and is a cure for schizophrenia within ellins and chimera.

Belladonna

Atropa Bella-donna

Aka: Deadly Nightshade /
Dangerous Knight Lore /
Perilous Martianoide

Native to Greenbury and grows
wild around the forests of
Balachor.

Anaesthetic, hallucinogenic,
and highly toxic even in small quantities.





Calendula

Petals of this medicinal herb can be ground into a paste for many anti-inflammatory potions. Most notable is "Glublok pâté" used for comforting the swelling of web-footed swamplings.

Widely used by apothecaries to aide digestion and ward off the distress of arthritis. Difficult to obtain as the scent can attract monstrosities such as basilisks and horta-gorgons.



Cat's-claw

Feverfew

Similar in appearance to a bush of daisies.

Eases joint-pains.

Few people have fevers after taking this when distilled in water from Greenbury's central river



Root Ginger

The most versatile of all roots growing in Greenbury. Can be cooked, sugared, used to make tea, and spread on toast. It can also be made into a potion to levitate cats, make umbrellas invisible, and fly through orange painted fences.



Elderflower

In Greenbury, this extraordinary plant acquired its name from the distinguished (most often aged) people whom enjoy the flavour of infusions made with this plant.

Only the flowers and berries of the plant are edible, the leaves and stem are poisonous.

Elderflower is suggested to hold extra special powers in softening the stone of golems.




Chamomile



Native to Greenbury and the northern quarter. Can be used in a mild infusion to treat stress and insomnia.

Useful as muscle relaxant following strain injuries. Succubi are allergic to chamomile.

Magnolia

Hardy flowering tree, pre-dating the bee and wood nymph. This ancient bloom has been a symbol of persistence and strength for centuries.


Good for perfume and bubble-bath.

Liverwort

Foetid spongy mass, largely prevalent in humid locations.

Many species grow in clumps around tree roots and stony ruins.

Tastes foul, but is wholesome and nourishing.



Poppy

Colourful, herbaceous plant, source of medicinal, pain-numbing seeds. Can be used in sleep potions and integrated into other concoctions for additional, comforting effect.



Valerian

Perennial flowering plant, vividly pink and heavily perfumed. Works as a mild sedative but causes drowsiness even in small doses. Can also be used to treat minor wounds when mixed into a paste. When further diluted in alcohol and water, Valerian may be used to treat anxiety.


